Ground breaking held on May 4, 2009



Groundbreaking for a new fire station located at 3610 S. 263rd St. was held on May 4, 2009. Fire Station #39 will serve the citizens of Sedgwick County Fire District #1. It is located at 263rd St. W. between 31st St. S. and MacArthur Rd. The new 9,720 sq. ft. facility will have living quarters and space for two bays for fire trucks only. EMS will not be available. The building will be comprised of block and brick. Construction is scheduled to be completed in January of 2010. When completed, "the new station offers a potential savings of more than \$500,000/year in fire insurance premiums for people within a five mile area". <http://www.sedgwickcounty.org/fire/> Architect for the project is Richard B. Kraybill. Estimator / Project Manager is Adam Doll and Job Superintendents are Alan Carlyle and Marty Kerr.

Ground breaking ceremonies were held on May 2, 2008. Friday, April 24, 2009 dedication ceremonies were held for the completion of the 9,300 sq. ft. Sun Chips Business Incubator building . The city of Greensburg and USDA's Rural Development organization teamed together to provide a location for small businesses to begin and grow. The first floor contains retail space and the second level houses business offices and a conference room. The building is designed to be a LEED Platinum Level building. The following is a list of sustainable features that were incorporated in the construction of this facility:

- Habitat Restorative Site Development
- Photovoltaic Energy System - 6.8 KW Peak Power Anticipated
- Geothermal Heat Pumps - 57.1% total Building Energy Savings
- Natural Daylighting
- Rainwater Collection System - 94.5% Total Water Savings
- Recycled Gray-water System
- 419,600 lbs. of Construction Waste Diverted from the Landfill
- High-Performance building envelope materials including ICF's (insulated concrete forms) & fiber-cement cladding
- 25% Recycled Building Material Content

Office Addition Frontier Refinery: El Dorado, KS

The new addition to existing office space for Frontier Refinery located at 1401 Douglas Rd., El Dorado, KS was completed in May of 2009. The 5,000 sq. ft. addition consisted of sixteen offices, and a conference room. Remodel of existing office space was also included in this project. Architect was

Jaswal Convenience Store: Wichita, KS

Construction was completed at the end of June on a new convenience store located 2838 W. Central, at the corner of Central and St. Paul. The design-build project was a remodel of an existing building that involved drywall, ceiling work, painting and repair of paving. The owner is Petro America. The Estimator / Project Manager was Gib Compton.



New Projects

Greensburg Public Works Building: Greensburg, KS

Work began the first of July on the replacement of the Greensburg City Maintenance Building heavily damaged in the May '07 tornado. Demolition and construction was put on hold while five large engine-generator units were sold and moved. Each had a combined weight of 100,000 lbs. each. The first step of the project has been to tear down what remained standing from the tornado and sorting the materials for recycling. The brick will be salvaged for the City Hall project. The 6,000 sq. ft. pre-cast office building will include space for vehicle maintenance, a wash bay, vehicle lift crane and a FEMA structure. A 5,850 sq. ft. pre-engineered wood structure will also be built for vehicle storage. A third component of the project is the addition of 800 sq. ft. of an existing metal building. Construction is scheduled to take twelve months. Architect, Jeff Weiford, of MuCluggage Van Sickle & Perry, Todd Hinshaw Estimator / Project Manager and David Spoon, Job Superintendent are working together on their second Greensburg building project in as many years. This will be a LEEDS certified constructed facility.
